**BROTHER DAN LAUBER
PASSED AWAY SUNDAY, JULY 20**

We are sad to inform our St. Joe community that Brother Dan Lauber passed away early Sunday morning. Fellow brother, teacher and friend Brother John Brennan wrote, "While Dan's death was not unexpected, it is always difficult when a loved one is taken from us, no matter what his medical condition might have been. One thing is for certain, Dan is at peace now in the Lord, and, I am sure that he has been welcomed into everlasting happiness by our Blessed Mother Mary whom Dan loved so very much! In truth, I never knew anyone who had so many rosary beads! His favorite rosary beads and his precious statue of St. Joseph will be with him when he is waked this weekend in New York."

Dan will be waked from the Christian Brothers nursing home, the St. Joseph Residence, in New Rochelle, New York this Friday. The funeral Mass will be at 9:30 a.m. on Saturday morning at Holy Family Church, which is also in New Rochelle.

Both St. Joseph Residence and Holy Family Church are adjacent to the Christian Brothers college, Iona College. After the funeral Mass Dan will be buried in our Brothers cemetery in West Park, New York, in the picturesque Hudson River Valley.

There will be no wake for Br. Dan in Mississippi. A memorial celebration of Brother Dan's life will be held in our St. Joseph Fine Arts Center in September or October. The day and time will be announced soon.

Jeremy will alternate between St. Therese and Christ the King/St. Mary each week, i.e. this weekend Fr. Jeremy will celebrate all Masses at St. Therese while Fr. Ric celebrates all Masses at Christ the King/St. Mary -- each weekend they will switch. A similar rotation has been set for Weekday Masses. Any adjustments to this system will be communicated to parishioners in advance.

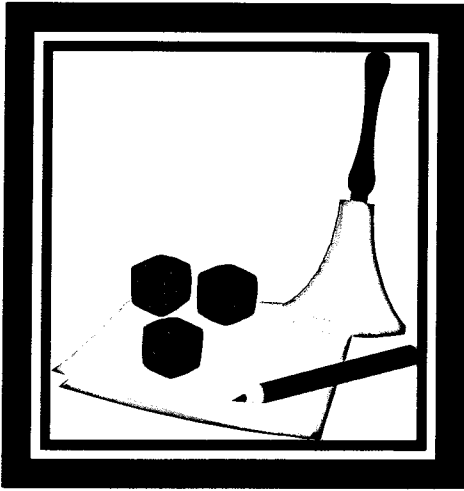
