Our Canonization Year of Celebration is coming to an end!

Last year, our parish held a celebration to honor the Canonization of St. Zelie and St. Louis Martin, the parents of our patron, St. Therese of Lisieux. We celebrated with a bilingual Mass and a picnic on the grounds. The last item on our celebration list is a pilgrimage to the National Shrine of St. Therese. The Shrine features a chapel and museum, and is on the Carmelite Campus in Darien, Illinois.

One group making the pilgrimage plans to leave on Friday, Oct. 14 and return Sunday, Oct. 16. This group will travel by car (approx. 12-hour drive). If you'd like to join this pilgrimage, please call the parish office to leave your name and contact information. If you cannot join this group, consider these options:

- 1. Gather a group to travel to the Shrine on another date.
- 2. Attend Mass at another parish named after St. Therese of Lisieux, the Child Jesus, or Little Flower. (St. Teresa of Avila is not the same saint.)
- 3. Read more about St. Zelie and St. Louis Martin.
- 4. Make a novena to St. Zelie and St. Louis Martin.
- 5. Pray for safe travels for those on the pilgrimage.
