With joy, we announce the arrival of the Saltillo Mission book. The book chronicles the history of Saltillo Mission since its inception and contains four chapters on the founder of Saltillo Mission, Fr. Patrick Quinn. This year marks the 20th anniversary of his death and two years from now we celebrate the golden jubilee of the mission. The book explains why Mississippi got involved in the mission, what Mississippians did for the mission and what the mission did for us. It has two chapters on the Saltillo Summer program where more than 20,000 of our youth visited the mission since its inception and it has many human-interest stories in it.
