Celebrating the Day of the Dead has long been a tradition in Mexico. During the days of the Dead, some believe that the souls of the departed return to earth to visit with and to provide council or give advice to family and loved ones.

Where possible, families would visit family grave sites, clean them up, and decorate the graves. In the United States this is rarely possible. Many set up altars in their homes in remembrance of their departed relatives.

Members of 12:30pm Mass will set up and decorate tables in the gathering space on October 28th, but all members of St. Therese are invited to participate, in bringing pictures of their deceased relatives, something that was special to the deceased family member and enjoy this remembrance celebration. Did you know...

Traffickers are continually trolling the internet posing as a teen girl or boy interested in friendship. They often use social media sites like Facebook, Instagram and Snapchat to recruit teenagers. The relationship with the teen is initially developed without threat, but after securing the teen's love or loyalty, the unsuspecting teen agrees to send compromising photos, share personal information or secretly meet in person. The predator then begins to separate the teen from her/his safety nets, leaving the teen vulnerable to be forced into prostitution or other forms of slavery.
